

## SCDOH WOUND CARE FORMULARY

DRESSING GENERIC CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION/FORMULATION	TRADE NAME
Silver Dressing	Anti-microbial binding, provides effective barrier to bacterial penetration, absorbs odor, may reduce infection or colonization of wounds	Actisorb
Compression Systems	Multi-layer systems to absorb venous ulcer drainage and provide 30-40mmHg support to vascular systems.	Profore Unnaboosts w/calamine
Barriers	Petroleum or Dimethicone containing ointments or prep-pads that coat skin and make it impervious to fluids.	Skinprep Calmeseptine Butt Paste
Impregnated Gauze Dressings	Manufactured in many forms; woven and non-woven, impregnated and non-adherent	Adaptic (porus) Xeroform
Transparent film	Polyurethane or copolymer with porous adhesive layer that allows oxygen to pass through the membrane and moisture vapor to escape.	Tegadrem
Hydrocolloid	Hydrophilic colloid particles bound to polyurethane foam; impermeable to bacteria and other contaminants; minimal to moderate absorptive properties.	Duoderm
Hydrogel	Water or glycerin-based non-adherent crossed-linked polymer; Variable polymer; variable absorptive properties; contains 80-99% water.	SAF-Gel
Calcium Alginate	Non-woven composite of fibers from calcium alginate, a cellulose-like polysaccharide, highly absorptive dressing manufactured from brown seaweed. Forms a soft gel when mixed with wound fluid.	CA-Alginate CA-Alginate Rope
Foams	Hydrophilic polyphilic polyurethane or gel film-coated foam, non-occlusive, non-adherent, absorptive wound dressing.	Polyderm
Collagens	Collagen is a major protein of the body. Dressing stimulates cellular migration and contributes to new tissue development and wound debridement.
