


Enclosed is a copy of the 2003 SCHOHARIE COUNTY PROFILE prepared for Schoharie County by the Southern Tier East Regional Planning Development Board with the financial support of the Appalachian Regional Commission. The Southern Tier East Regional Planning Development Board is an Affiliate State Census Data Center, and routinely works with the State Census Data Center housed in Empire State Development. As part of its function as a data center affiliate, the regional planning board assists in the collection and distribution of census information, and over the last several decades has produced a large number of interpretive reports and studies providing information about the region and its inhabitants. This is the most recent in a series of profile documents produced by the Regional Board over the past couple of decades.

This publication is intended to serve as a primary resource for basic information concerning the people, economy, and culture of Schoharie County. It relies principally upon resources from the U.S. Census, both the decennial census and the economic censuses, but also includes topics from a variety of state and local sources. This document presents the basic information together with additional information intended to promote a fuller understanding of the significance of the data. It is anticipated that this document will be periodically updated as additional information becomes available over the years.
