Cobleskill Regional Hospital is a 40-bed not-for-profit hospital founded by the people of Schoharie County in 1956. The hospital provides a broad range of inpatient and outpatient services, including an emergency department staffed around-the-clock by highly qualified physicians, inpatient care for medical conditions, outpatient surgery, short-stay inpatient rehabilitation, outpatient rehabilitative services (including physical therapy), open MRI and state-of-the-art medical imaging, comprehensive laboratory services, a sleep lab, and 19 specialty clinics in areas such as cardiology, women's health, orthopedics, and more.

**Emergency Services** The doctors and nurses of Cobleskill Regional Hospital's Emergency Department care for more than 12,000 patients per year. . Patients are entitled to a medical screening in the Emergency Department regardless of ability to pay. Patients of all ages, with all types of illnesses or injuries, are treated,. About one in three of our patients requires high-level emergency care, so we're accustomed to dealing with medically complex emergencies

For most cases, we provide total diagnosis, care, and treatment on site. For those who need the highly specialized services of a major medical center, Cobleskill Regional Hospital serves as a gateway to the appropriate level of needed services. In many instances, our affiliation with Bassett Healthcare facilitates access to advanced services and follow-up at Mary Imogene Hospital in Cooperstown and with Bassett Healthcare specialists.

**Inpatient Services** are available for adults who require hospitalization for medical conditions. Patients are admitted by physicians in the community or through the Emergency Department. Cobleskill Regional Hospital's inpatient unit is staffed by a team of experienced registered nurses, licensed practical nurses and certified nurse's aides who provide caring and personalized care. **Short-Stay Rehabilitation Program** The hospital offers comprehensive short-term inpatient care for patients who are unable to recover from an injury or illness at home. Patients and their families often turn to this program following a brief hospital stay or in place of full-scale

hospitalization for a major health problem. This program stresses continued recovery and assists patients with returning to a more independent level of functioning. Many of the patients in the Short-Stay Rehabilitation Program are over age 65 and have healthcare coverage through Medicare. In general, to be covered under Medicare the patient must

- Have been hospitalized for 3 or more nights within the past 30 days
- Have partially recovered
- Require skilled care on a daily basis (includes intravenous medication, complex wound care and dressing changes, post-surgical follow-up care, monitoring of new/changed medications, and rehabilitative therapies for strengthening and endurance)

**Surgical Services** Same-day surgery is offered at Cobleskill Regional Hospital. Among the physicians who perform surgical procedures at CRH are general surgeons, orthopedic specialists, gynecologists, ear-nose-throat specialists, and gastroenterologists. These specialists, as well as the surgical team's anesthesiologists, are affiliated with Bassett Healthcare. Foot surgery and procedures performed by podiatrists are also available. The hospital's surgical team also includes a group of highly skilled and experienced OR nurses. Recovery generally takes place right in the surgical suite for same-day surgery and the emphasis is on preventing complications following surgery and ensuring appropriate follow-up care. Our fully licensed and certified therapists offer a complete range of outpatient physical therapy services designed to help patients restore strength, movement, and functioning and to prevent disability due to disease, injury, or aging. The Department is open from 7:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. from Tuesday through Thursday, and from 7:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. on Mondays and Fridays. Occupational therapy and speech therapy are also available during extended hours by special arrangement.

**Laboratory** The hospital operates a main laboratory at the hospital on Grandview Drive in Cobleskill and a satellite blood work station at 1 Cooley Drive in Delanson. Each year, the BHSC laboratory processes in excess of 175,000 tests. The lab employs approximately 22 people, including technologists and phlebotomists.

The Cobleskill Regional Hospital laboratory has earned the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval. The award of accreditation is for a two-year period ending in July 2008.

Laboratory outpatient services are available at both sites without appointments. The Delanson site is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to noon. The main laboratory, located at the hospital on Grandview Drive in Cobleskill, is open Monday through Friday, from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. In addition, the main laboratory is open Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.; however, an appointment is necessary. **Sleep Lab** The comfortable four-bed Sleep Lab is located on the upper level, next to our newly renovated Ambulatory Care Center. It is staffed by an experienced technician, with support from a patient access specialist and a secretary. It is open three nights per week for sleep studies, which are used to diagnose sleep disorders, such as sleep apnea and periodic limb movement disorder. Call 518-254-3317 for information.

**Social Work Services** provides a wide-range of services to all clinical areas of the hospital. Assessments and referrals for all psychological and psychosocial issues are provided, including but not limited to, child abuse, sexual assault, domestic violence, mental illness, chemical dependency, and adjustment to chronic or terminal illness by referral. HIV counseling and testing are provided by referral. Discharge planning for patients going home, to adult homes and nursing homes is routinely provided.

**Support Groups** are offered in cancer support for patients and family members/loved ones and Alzheimer's support for caregivers.

**Lifeline** is a personal response service that allows people to live independently and ensures those living at home receives quick assistance when they need it. Once activated a Lifeline professional responds, assesses the situation calls for help, be it a loved one, neighbor or an ambulance. Call 518-254-3210 for information.

**Community Service Program** The hospital provides care to many people each year who do not have health insurance and are unable to pay their bill. Through this program, patients who do not have insurance and have been denied coverage by Medicaid during the past six months may qualify for free care. Others may qualify for a discount on care. Discounts are made on a sliding scale depending on income. Patients must fill out an application for the Community Services program and provide proof of Medicaid denial within the past six months, and provide proof of income to qualify for free care.
